Posit Workbench supports launching Visual Studio Code sessions from the Posit Workbench home page. [Visual Studio Code](#) (VS Code) is a popular source-code editor built by Microsoft. Posit Workbench supports the use of VS Code through an open source server-based implementation of VS Code called [code-server](#).

Start a VS Code session

To start a new session:

- From the Posit Workbench home page, click + **New Session**.
- Click the **VS Code** button.
- Click the **Start Session** button.

Once the session is ready Posit Workbench automatically opens VS Code in your current browser window.

If you do not see **VS Code** as an option in the Editor drop-down, then please reach out to your System Administrator for Posit Workbench.

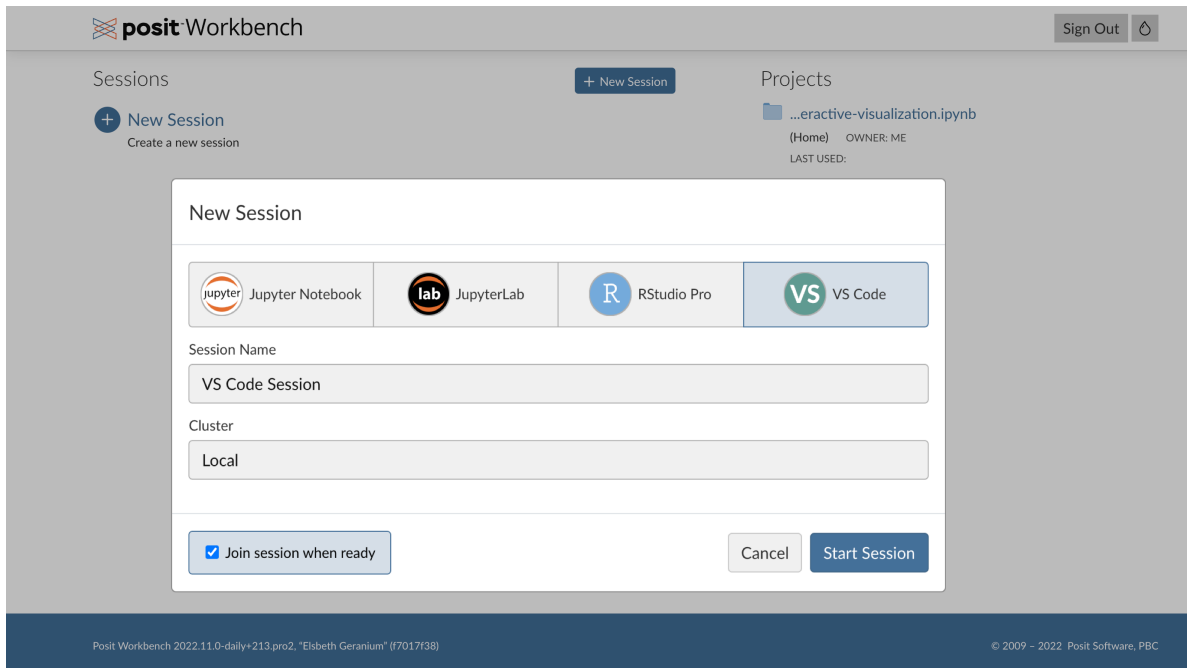
